SPECIAL CONDITIONS

ARTICLE 1 – SUBJECT MATTER OF THE AGREEMENT

- 1.1 The institution shall provide support to the participant for undertaking a mobility activity for training under the Erasmus+ Programme.
- 1.2 The participant accepts the financial support or the provision of services as specified in article 3 and undertakes to carry out the mobility activity for training as described in Annex I.
- 1.3 Amendments to the agreement shall be requested and agreed by both parties through a formal notification by letter or by electronic message.

ARTICLE 2 – ENTRY INTO FORCE AND DURATION OF MOBILITY

- 2.1 The agreement shall enter into force on the date when the last of the two parties signs.
- 2.2 The mobility period shall start on **27 May 2019** and end on **31 May 2019**. The start date of the mobility period shall be the first day that the participant needs to be present at the receiving institution and the end date shall be the last day the participant needs to be present at the receiving institution.
One day for travel before the first day of the activity abroad or one day for travel following the last day of the activity abroad shall be added to the duration of the mobility period and included in the calculation for individual support.

- 2.3 The participant shall receive financial support from Erasmus+ EU funds for five (5) days of activity.
- 2.4 The total duration of the mobility period shall not exceed 2 months, with a minimum of 5 days per mobility activity.
- ~~2.5 The participant may submit any request concerning the extension of the mobility period within the limit set out in article 2.4. If the institution agrees to extend the duration of the originally planned mobility period, the agreement shall be amended accordingly. [NOT APPLICABLE].~~
- 2.6 The Certificate of Attendance shall provide the effective start and end dates of the mobility period, as well as detailed description of the training/job shadowing/workshops, meetings, and any other activities stipulated in the mobility programme agreed (Annex I).

ARTICLE 3 – FINANCIAL SUPPORT

- 3.1 The participant shall receive EUR 840 corresponding to individual support (subsistence), which is calculated as follows: EUR 140 per diem for 6 days, and EUR 180 corresponding to travel. ~~The amount of individual support is EUR 140 per day up to the 14th day of activity and EUR 98 per day from the 15th day.~~ Total Erasmus+ grant for this mobility activity amounts to one thousand and twenty Euro (EUR 1.020).

The final grant amount for the mobility period is determined by multiplying the number of days of the mobility specified in article 2.3 with the individual support rate applicable per day for the receiving country, and adding the contribution for travel to the amount obtained.

- ~~3.2 The reimbursement of costs incurred in connection with special needs, when applicable, shall be based on the supporting documents provided by the participant [not applicable].~~
- 3.3 The financial support may not be used to cover costs already funded by EU funds.
- 3.4 Notwithstanding Article 3.3, the financial support is compatible with any other source of funding.
- 3.5 The financial support or part of it shall be recovered if the participant does not carry out the mobility activity in compliance with the terms of the agreement. However, reimbursement shall not be requested when the participant has been prevented from completing his/her mobility activities as described in Annex I due to force majeure. Such cases shall be reported by the institution and accepted by the National Agency.

ARTICLE 4 – PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

- 4.1 A pre-financing payment shall be made to the participant representing 70% of the financial support from Erasmus+ EU funds specified in Article 3 before May 27th, and no later than the start date of the mobility period.
- 4.2 If payment under Article 4.1 is lower than 100% of the financial support, the submission of the online EU Survey shall be considered as the participant's request for payment of the balance of the financial support from Erasmus+ EU

funds. The institution shall have 45 calendar days to make the balance payment or to issue a recovery order in case a reimbursement is due.

- 4.3 The participant must provide proof of the actual dates of start and end of the mobility period, based on the Certificate of Attendance provided by the person responsible at the Institution that s/he will undertake the training, i.e. at the Open University of Cyprus.

ARTICLE 5 – EU SURVEY

- 5.1 The participant shall complete and submit the online EU Survey after the mobility abroad within 30 calendar days upon receipt of the invitation to complete it.
- 5.2 Participants who fail to complete and submit the online EU Survey may be required to partially or fully reimburse the financial support received.

ARTICLE 6 – INSURANCE


- 6.1 The participant shall have adequate insurance coverage.
- 6.2 Health insurance coverage is mandatory. The participant must provide the Open University of Cyprus with a copy of his national and/or private health insurance.

ARTICLE 7 – LAW APPLICABLE AND COMPETENT COURT

- 7.1 The Agreement is governed by laws of the Republic of Cyprus.
- 7.2 The competent court determined in accordance with the applicable national law shall have sole jurisdiction to hear any dispute between the institution and the participant concerning the interpretation, application or validity of this Agreement, if such dispute cannot be settled amicably.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Article 1: Liability

Each party of this agreement shall exonerate the other from any civil liability for damages suffered by him or his staff as a result of performance of this agreement, provided such damages are not the result of serious and deliberate misconduct on the part of the other party or his staff.

The National Agency of Cyprus, the European Commission or their staff shall not be held liable in the event of a claim under the agreement relating to any damage caused during the execution of the mobility period. Consequently, the National Agency of Cyprus or the European Commission shall not entertain any request for indemnity of reimbursement accompanying such claim.

Article 2: Termination of the agreement

In the event of failure by the participant to perform any of the obligations arising from the agreement, and regardless of the consequences provided for under the applicable law, the institution is legally entitled to terminate or cancel the agreement without any further legal formality where no action is taken by the participant within one month of receiving notification by registered letter.

If the participant terminates the agreement before its agreement ends or if he/she

fails to follow the agreement in accordance with the rules, he/she shall have to refund the amount of the grant already paid except if agreed differently with the institution.

In case of termination by the participant due to "force majeure", i.e. an unforeseeable exceptional situation or event beyond the participant's control and not attributable to error or negligence on his/her part, the participant shall be entitled to receive the amount of the grant corresponding to the actual duration of the mobility period as defined in article 2.2. Any remaining funds shall have to be refunded except if agreed differently with the institution.

Article 3: Data Protection

All personal data contained in the agreement shall be processed in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the EU institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data. Such data shall be processed solely in connection with the implementation and follow-up of the agreement by the sending institution, the National Agency and the European Commission, without prejudice to the possibility of passing the data to the

bodies responsible for inspection and audit in accordance with EU legislation (Court of Auditors or European Antifraud Office (OLAF)).

The participant may, on written request, gain access to his personal data and correct any information that is inaccurate or incomplete. He/she should address any questions regarding the processing of his/her personal data to the sending institution and/or the National Agency. The participant may lodge a complaint against the processing of his personal data with the [national supervising body for data protection] with regard to the use of these data by the sending institution, the National Agency, or to the European Data Protection Supervisor with regard to the use of the data by the European Commission.

Article 4: Checks and Audits

The parties of the agreement undertake to provide any detailed information requested by the European Commission, the National Agency of Cyprus or by any other outside body authorised by the European Commission or the National Agency of Cyprus to check that the mobility period and the provisions of the agreement are being properly implemented.
