The SDGs can only be achieved with a strong commitment to partnership and cooperation at the international level. Having improved access to technology and knowledge, it is an important means of exchanging ideas and promoting innovation. The sustainable development goals seek to enhance cooperation between countries by supporting plans to achieve all goals. Amman Arab University has achieved effective participation and contribution to this goal through the following:

1. The university has emerged directly and as a contributor to the national government and regional NGOs in the development of sustainable development goals policies. The most important of this development is identifying problems and challenges, developing policies and strategies, modeling potential future contracts with interventions, monitoring and reporting on interventions, and enabling adaptive management. The university has established the headquarters of the Council for Sustainable Development at the level of the entire Arab world, in addition to its membership in the Regional Network for Social Responsibility, in addition to its membership in the Sustainable Development Solutions Network.


2. Encouraging faculty members to participate in a comprehensive dialogue with various sectors on the goals of sustainable development. The university achieves this through the participation of its faculty members in local, regional and international conferences that enhance the concept of partnership to achieve the goals and through holding and organizing conferences within the campus walls, including the conference: Scientific Research in the Age of Digitalization, and a roadmap for sustainable development conference that was held via video conference due to the Corona pandemic.
3. Amman Arab University also worked on international participation in the process of collecting or measuring data for the sustainable development goals, and this was achieved through international projects, Erasmus Plus, seminars and workshops in various countries.
4. Coping with the university's keenness to provide students with skills, competencies, development and education for its students with regard to sustainable development, it has introduced optional and compulsory courses in its specializations, which number 137, in addition to the presence of specializations that contain materials related to sustainable development, which are compulsory. The student is not allowed to graduate and obtain a degree, whether he is a bachelor or a master's degree unless completing these requirements.
5. The university has a full specialization related to the sustainable development goals related to the energy standard SDF 7, which is the specialization of renewable energy engineering.
